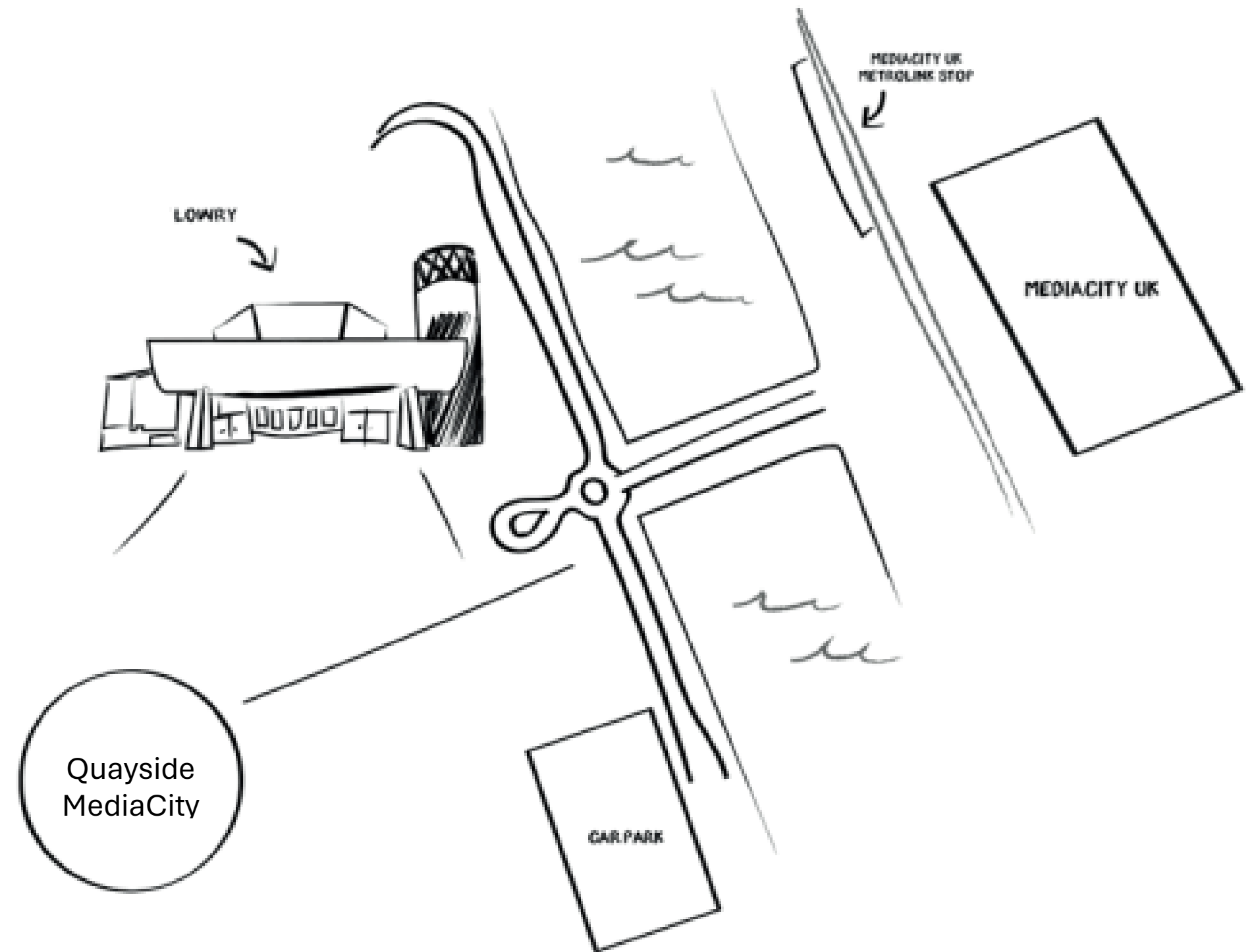

1. Finding Lowry

Lowry is located on the Salford Quays and can be found on Pier 8 right next to the river.

It can be quite cold and windy outside, but it will be warm inside the building



1. Finding Lowry

Lowry is a large, metal and glass building made of lots of different shapes.

The entrance is located in a big square opposite the Quayside shopping centre.



2. When you arrive

Lowry has one main entrance that is at street level with step-free access. This floor is a largely level surface with tactile paving.

There is textured matt flooring in the entrance to Lowry building and the doors are automatic when activated by a push-button.



2. When you arrive

You will enter the building through the right set of doors. There will be friendly members of the Security Team to greet you.

You may be asked to open your bag so it can be checked, but don't worry, the team are doing this to help keep visitors safe.



3. Welcome Desk

The Front of House team are at the Welcome Desk during opening hours to welcome you and offer assistance, they can help you find your way around the building.

Inside the building it is very colourful with orange, yellow, red and purple surfaces. The floor is reflective, hard and slightly sloped.



4. Take a seat

Look for the bright yellow Reserved table signs where you can rest and wait before heading into THE LYRIC THEATRE.

The Tower Café serves warm teas and coffees, and yummy cakes.



5. Toilets

The Reserved Tables are near to the accessible toilets and Changing Places which are found on the lower level.



6. Lyric Theatre

Listen to the announcements and when it says 3 mins until the show starts, then head into THE LYRIC THEATRE and take your seat

The welcoming and friendly Front of House team are here to help. They will be wearing purple tops as seen in the image.



7. The Production



Length

This show is **2 hours and 50 minutes** long. This includes a 20-minute interval. The first and second half are both around **75 minutes** long.

Please do not take photographs or use your phone during the performance. Cameras and phones may be used in the foyer.

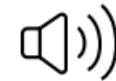
7. The Production



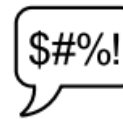
Dear England contains:
