It is a range of projects which combine cross-curricular, classroom activity with performance by children in professional theatre spaces.

Who was William Shakespeare?

Many people believe William Shakespeare is the best playwright ever. As well as writing plays, he was also an actor and poet.

He was born in Stratford upon Avon in 1564.

Shakespeare moved to London, where he lived for 25 years. He wrote over 35 plays during his life.

He died at his home in Stratford on April 23, 1616 - his 52nd birthday.
